



USC Fire Safety Hot Work Permit

A Hot Work Permit is required for any work that uses a flame, creates a spark, or produces smoke. Requests for a permit shall be received by USC Fire Safety at least 24 hours prior to the start of work. A copy of the approved permit must be kept on site at all times when hot work is being performed. The hot work permit is not valid unless approved by USC Fire Safety.

- Combustible construction in the area is protected
- Approved actions have been taken to prevent accidental activation of suppression and detection equipment
- Fire watch shall be provided for the duration of hot work and shall remain on site for 30 minutes after the completion of any hot work performed.
