## 2014 International Student Enrollment Report



## Data Summary

The International Student Enrollment Report provides an overview of international student enrollment at the University of South Carolina for the Fall 2014 term. This report includes all international students enrolled at the main campus of Columbia. For reporting purposes, "international" is understood as a non-U.S. citizen student, holding any visa status other than Legal Permanent Residency. In addition, data is reported on English Programs for Internationals (EPI), the University's intensive English program on the Columbia campus. EPI data can be found on page 6 of this report.

International student enrollment has increased since Fall 2013.

International student enrollment on the Columbia campus dropped post-September 11, 2001, from a peak of 1,279 in the year 2000. Currently, 1,441 international students represent $4.6 \%$ of the total campus enrollment $(31,311)$.

At the time this data was collected, both the University of Georgia and the University of Virginia were only able to provide rough estimates.
