Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How long does it to take to complete the Bachelor Arts in Organizational Leadership?

A: Completion time varies based on already accumulated general education credits, and courses necessary to complete major concentration. The degree requires 120 credit hours. It is up to the student and advisor to decide the appropriate number of hours to take each semester.

Q: Is financial aid available? How much does the program cost?

A: Yes, students are eligible to receive applicable federal financial aid assistance, state lottery education assistance. Current fees and tuition rates can be viewed at **palmettocollege.sc.edu**.

Q: Is the degree awarded by the University of South Carolina?

A: Yes, the degree is awarded by USC and meets the same rigorous standards and accreditation as any traditional degree from the University.

Do I even need a bachelor's degree?

What can I do with a BOL degree?

foundation for students who want to work in leadership roles in a variety of community settings. A student's goal may be a leadership position in a government agency, with a nonprofit organization, or in a business setting. The BOL degree, with its combination of common professional foundations courses and individually selected major courses, can be structured to give the student the appropriate preparation for leadership in the chosen area.
