Rationale for Proposed Revisions

• At present, the manual states that "Normally, no campus shall have more than one member on the Executive Committee," while also mandating that officers of the executive committee are nominated and elected. These two rules are incompatible, and the procedure for what should happen if two candidates to executive committee positions getting the most votes are from the same campus.

Summary of Proposed Revisions

- We propose removing the requirement that the executive committee contain at most one member from each campus, and maintaining campus representation by changing how at-large members are elected. In our proposal, the end-of-year elections for Vice-Chair and Secretary are as normal (the chair and immediate past chair having already been determined). Between senate meetings, any campus not represented by these four positions may then elect an at-large member from their Faculty Organization to serve on the executive committee.
- Additionally, to allow campuses flexibility in their senate delegation, these at-large members
 may choose to be full members of the Executive Committee or choose only to meet with the
 Executive Committee. (The difference here is that this allows a campus short on senators to
 have representation in the room when the executive committee meets without that senator
 giving up their vote or their seat on one of the standing committee.)

These officers shall perform the duties prescribed by the parliamentary authority and rules adopted by the Senate. The Secretary shall serve for a term of one year. Section 2. The Vice Chair and the Secretary shall be nominated and elected at the last Senate meeting of the year preceding the one during which they are to serve. They shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee or from the floor. Any voting member of the faculty may offer a nomination for Vice Chair and Secretary from the floor; however, only members of the Senate may vote in the election of these officers. Only voting members of the Senate and members of the Executive Committee shall be eligible for these offices. The Vice Chair shall assume the office of Chair at the close of the last meeting of the academic year.

Page Each Senate meeting of the year preceding the one during which they are to serve. They shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee or from the floor. Any voting member of the faculty may offer a nomination for Vice Chair and Secretary from the floor; however, only members of the Senate may vote in the election of these officers. Only voting members of the Senate and members of the Executive Committee shall be eligible for these offices. The Vice Chair shall assume the office of Chair at the close of the last meeting of the academic year.

Section 3. After election of the officers for the following year, any campus which does not have a member serving on the executive committee (either as Secretary, Vice Chair, Chair, or Immediate Past Chair) may elect from its Faculty Organization a Member-at-Large. A Member-at-Large will meet and have voting privileges in the Executive Committee, but may choose whether or not to serve as a member of the executive committee. A senator serving as Memberat-Large may in this way retain voting privileges in the Senate and may retain membership on a standing committee of the senate. Once elected, a Member-at-Large who is a sitting senator shall notify their Faculty Organization whether they will serve as a member of the executive committee, so as to allow their campus to elect a replacement senator if necessary.
