Frequently Asked Questions

Prospective students often ask how long the Bachelor of Arts in Public Health takes to complete, what the program costs and if financial aid is available, and if the degree is awarded through UofSC Beaufort.

You can find answers to these questions below.

- Completion time varies based on already accumulated general education credits and courses necessary to complete the major concentration. The degree requires 120 credit hours. It is up to the student and advisor to decide the appropriate number of hours to take each semester.
- Students are eligible to receive applicable federal and state financial aid assistance. Current fees and tuition rates can be viewed at www.palmettocollege. sc.edu.
- The degree is awarded by the University of South Carolina Beaufort and meets the same rigorous standards and accreditation as any traditional degree from UofSC.

Difference between B.A. and B.S. in Public Health

The B.A. degree situates students for entry into social science-based graduate programs and entry-level public health professional positions, while the B.S. degree aims to prepare those students for further study of natural and environmental public health sciences, other clinical professions and entry-level public health professional positions.

A bachelor of arts degree in public health is fit for someone pursuing work focused on health education and promotion, public health policy and administration, public health nursing, or non-profit/governmental work.

Curriculum

Our public health program is grounded in the seven areas of responsibility for health educators as identified by the National Commission for Heath Education Credentialing.

The curriculum includes coursework in the following disciplines:

- Epidemiology 3 credit hours
- Research and Field Experience 6 credit hours
- Internship & Evaluation 7 credit hours
- Leadership and Management 3 credit hours
- Program Development & Evaluation 6 credit hours
