Combine your undergraduate and graduate accounting degrees to save time and money.

WHY ACCELERATE?

The Accelerated program is available to undergraduate accounting majors and other majors completing the accounting cognate. It allows you to "double count" up to four classes for undergraduate and graduate credit. "Double counting" these classes allows you to:



Finish the MACC program in less time and save up to \$7,200 in tuition



Use your undergraduate scholarships to pay for up to 40 percent of your MACC degree



Meet the 150-hour CPA license education requirement and earn a graduate degree in the same amount of time it takes to double major



Enjoy a reduced schedule in the MACC program, which will allow you to complete the CPA Exam by graduation



HOW IT WORKS

To participate in Accelerated and "double count" courses, you must be admitted to the MACC program, confirm your enrollment, and submit the required Accelerated forms each semester you wish to "double count" at least one course.

- Courses numbered 500

 and higher can be taken
 under Accelerated for both
 undergraduate and graduate
 credit. Courses numbered 700
 and higher may be applied to
 undergraduate elective options.
- Accelerated students earn graduate credit for the 600-level versions of the accounting major elective courses.
- Accelerated courses are not limited to ACCT courses. This allows undergraduate electives to "double count" as MACC electives.
- Honors College Students:
 Accelerated courses taken for graduate credit may count as honors sections. Please discuss this with your honors college advisor.
- Core 700-level MACC courses must be taken as an undergraduate to complete your MACC on an accelerated timeline.

ELIGIBILITY

Any UofSC student **admitted** to the MACC program meeting the following requirements may participate in Accelerated:

90

AT LEAST 90 CREDIT HOURS **3.40**

MINIMUM 3.40 CUMULATIVE GPA 3.00

MAINTAIN A 3.00 MINIMUM ULA GPA (400-LEVEL AND UP) WITH NO MORE THAN 2 GRADES BELOW A B

GMAT WAIVERS

are available to UofSC students meeting the following requirements:

90

AT LEAST 90 CREDIT HOURS 3.40

MINIMUM 3.40 CUMULATIVE GPA 3

MINIMUM OF 3 ULA COURSES COMPLETED 3.25

3.25 MINIMUM ULA GPA (400-LEVEL AND UP) WITH NO MORE THAN 2 GRADES BELOW A B

If you do not qualify for the GMAT waiver, you may still participate in Accelerated if you are admitted and meet the Accelerated requirements above.

GETTING STARTED

Planning for Accelerated:

Follow the following steps to determine how Accelerated will work with your undergraduate program of study:

- **1.** Visit **sc.edu/moore/macc_accelerate** to learn more about the program.
- 2. Meet with your undergraduate advisor to identify your remaining degree requirements.
- 3. Use the Course Planning Worksheet to map out your remaining undergraduate courses.
- **4.** Meet with the MACC Accelerated Program Coordinator to discuss your Accelerated course plan.

Applying to the MACC Program:

The MACC program's application process is the same for all applicants – Accelerated or not.

- You must be admitted to the MACC program before you can "double count" courses.
- Apply for the Accelerated program during the last semester of your "junior" year (two semesters remaining) or when you meet the requirements, if later.
